Academic Achievement at École Sir John Franklin High School

1. Minister's Awards

Minister's Medals (Northwest Territories) are awarded for academic achievement in **Grade 12 Diploma Examinations**. For each Diploma examination subject, a Medal will be awarded to the student who receives the highest Diploma examination mark among all NWT students in that school year for each subject with a **minimum mark of 80%**. The Minister's Medals are mailed directly to the recipients after Student Records receives the final marks from the August Diploma examination-writing period and are confirmed by each school district. Winners will be recognized with a medal and certificate from the Minister of Education.

2. Governor-General's Medal

The Governor General's Academic Medals have recognized the outstanding scholastic achievements of students in Canada. They are awarded to the student graduating with the highest average from a high school. The average includes all grade 11 and grade 12 courses listed on the student's official transcript.

3. School Certificates

- **Honour Roll:** Students on the **Honour Roll** have achieved an 80% or higher course average a minimum of five courses over a school year. This average is calculated on a per credit basis. Students must have passing marks for all courses taken to be eligible.
- **Principal's List**: Students on the **Principal's List** have achieved a 90% or higher course average a minimum of five courses over a school year. This average is calculated on a per credit basis. Students must have passing marks for all courses taken to be eligible.

4. Department Awards

These award winners are selected by each department and the teachers of each course. The top students in each course will receive a certificate of achievement.

Q & A with Canadian Private Astronaut Mark Pathy on the ISS during the AX-1 Mission – April 2022

Students from Sir John were selected to join other schools from across Canada, to have a Q&A Session with a private astronaut on the International Space Station live over video.

On Thursday, April 14, Biology 20 and Physics 30 students were able to interact and ask questions of Astronaut Mark Pathy, who is a private business man, investor, philanthropist and mission specialist on the first-ever entirely private mission - the Space X – **AX-1 Mission** to the ISS.

During the Q & A Session, students asked Mark questions about his training, reasons for being a part of the mission, views on space exploration and experiments he was participating in. Students were able to see Mark live in the ISS and talk directly to him. Everyone involved were surprised by how comfortable it was to video chat with someone in Space. It felt like Mark was standing (floating) right in the classroom with everyone.

Planning for this event began in October and a special "Thank You" goes out to Mr. Mac Innis, Mr. Kirkham, Mr. Morozov and Ms. Young for making it happen.














SJF Green Team brings message to elementary schools!


