INTERNATIONAL TRANSGENDER DAY OF VISIBILITY

Wednesday, March 31st marks International Transgender Day of Visibility. This day is dedicated to celebrating transgender people, their contributions to society and raising awareness of discrimination faced by transgender people worldwide. March 31 is set aside separately from the Transgender Day of Remembrance in November to acknowledge and celebrate living members of the transgender community.

In 2002, the Northwest Territories became the first jurisdiction in Canada to explicitly add "gender identity" to its human rights legislation as a prohibited ground of discrimination.



International Day of Pink falls on April 14, 2021. UNITED WE STAND A CHANCE. Discrimination takes many shapes, whether it's based on race, age, disabilities, gender or sexuality. The 2SLGBTQIA+ community is no stranger to the bullying and violence that stems from hateful beliefs. So, every year, on the second Wednesday of April, we urge people around the world to put on a pink shirt and stand in solidarity with the 2SLGBTQIA+ community to continue fighting for equality and acceptance.


our team. The members did an amazing job! Scan the QR Code below to watch. Our team's part starts around 8:20.


