

Intensive French

Grade 6 Option • Range Lake North School and
École William McDonald Middle School

- Designed for students who have no previous, or limited, exposure to French language
- Up to 70% of programming provided in French for the first 5 months (Math instruction remains in English)
- Up to 23% 'Enhanced French' programming during the second 5 months when the language of instruction is English
- Project-based language acquisition

Post-Intensive French

Range Lake North School 7-8
École William McDonald Middle School 7-8
École Sir John Franklin High School 9-12

- Open only to students who successfully complete Grade 6 Intensive French, or have 1-2 years experience in French Immersion in early grades.
- Continue to develop French language communication skills
- Up to 230 hours per year of French programming

Core French

Grades 1 - 12 • All YK1 Schools with
English Track Programming

- Offered in YK1 schools as part of the English program
 - ~ Grade 1 to Grade 12
 - ~ 40-125 hours per year
 - ~ 2-5 times per week
- Familiarizes students with French language and culture
- Provides the opportunity for students to acquire some basic French language communication skills by the end of Grade 12

French Immersion

Entry Point: JK, Kindergarten and Grade 1
(Early Immersion)

Single-track:

- École J.H. Sissons (JK-5) Programs for a bilingual experience in a French environment
- Designed to help students develop a functional level of bilingualism by the end of Grade 12

•Dual-track:

École William McDonald Middle School (6-8)
École Sir John Franklin High School (9-12)
Both schools offer a French immersion program.

Immersion

- Entry Point: JK, Kindergarten & Grade 1
- K-2, All subjects taught in French
- Grade 3, English Language Arts instruction begins
- Grades 3 to 8, up to 80% of program is in French
- Grades 9-12, access to a full selection of French courses (Social Studies, Biology, Math, etc.)

Intake Options (Vary - available to current French Immersion students transferring from other schools)

Are French Immersion students taught the same program as those in English?

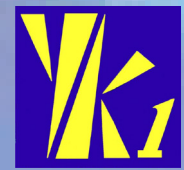
YES!

YK1 French Programs provide opportunities to:

Opportunities for students in YK1 Intensive/ Post-Intensive French Immersion Programs are further broadened to include:

- Learn in French-speaking environments
- Speak French with peers and French-speaking roles and models
- Strengthen English literacy skills
- Open doors to a broader range of choices in advanced education and career options
- Increase ability to master additional languages

French Immersion programs are designed for students whose first language is not French

Entry Point for students new to immersion: Junior Kindergarten, Kindergarten and Grade 1

Intake Levels for current French Immersion students new to YK1 can happen at any grade levels if students have enough French proficiency to follow the program.
