Junior Kindergarten to Grade 8

Range Lake North is an inclusive school. Our staff works hard to ensure that all children feel welcome and successful. Students work at various levels and follow various programs. To meet the broad range of needs, special talents and abilities of all learners, RLN uses research-based best-practice and differentiated instruction.

RLN offers students the opportunity to experience and participate in numerous extracurricular activities and clubs. Active participation helps to foster constructive and collaborative environments between students and across grade levels.

Literacy, numeracy and life!

RLN has a strong academic focus in areas of literacy and numeracy. Through a balanced literacy approach, students are engaged in diverse learning experiences where they develop their reading, writing and oral language skills. Students and teachers engage in inquiry based learning to explore and learn about the world around them.

RLN emphasizes teaching students mathematical concepts with real world connections. Students develop numeracy with a student centered, problem solving approach. Students build upon their understandings and learn new strategies so that mathematical concepts become meaningful to them.

Technology

Equipped with a virtual desktop and robotics lab, lego robotics lab, classroom laptops, chromebooks, print kit, classroom Smart Boards and document cameras, Range Lake North School provides students with a world of opportunity. Whether it's video production, the creation of slide shows for a project, coding or basic programming, or curriculum integrated technology experiences, students are actively engaged in their own learning. The development of these new, life-long skills, abilities and interests benefit students in the school and beyond the classroom.

Intensive & Post Intensive French

Intensive French (IF) is a second language teaching approach in which French is taught intensively for most of the day during the first five months of the Grade 6 year. The students in the program receive about 70% of their instruction in French during the first half of the year and 25% Post-Intensive French (PIF) during the second half; the rest of the curriculum (except for Mathematics) is taught in the second half of the year and taught in English. Math instruction is taught in English throughout the entire year. The Post-Intensive French program for Grades 7 and 8 students continues to help reinforce and develop French communication skills using the Intensive French approach. At the PIF level for Grades 7 & 8, 20% - 25% of the day is taught in French.
