Re: Accommodation of students during construction of new École J.H. Sissons (2020-2022)

After several meetings with Taylor Architecture Group (TAG), the GNWT's Department of Infrastructure and the GNWT's Department of Education, Culture and Employment (ECE), a draft accommodations plan with scenarios has been developed for two school years (2020-2022). TAG has completed walkthroughs of École William McDonald Middle School, École Sir John Franklin High School, N.J. Macpherson School and Range Lake North School and is now tasked with facilitating meetings with parents to discuss draft scenarios and other options that may come forward during these meetings.

In partnership with Yellowknife Education District no. 1 (YK1) and ECE, TAG will host three public meetings so that parents have multiple opportunities to hear draft scenarios and provide input. These meetings will take place at:

- École J.H. Sissons: Tuesday, April 23 at 7:00 p.m.
- École William McDonald Middle School: Wednesday, April 24 at 7:00 p.m.
- Range Lake North School: Thursday, April 25 at 7:00 p.m.

These meetings are open to all parents and stakeholders, regardless of where their children are currently enrolled. TAG will aim to put forward the most workable accommodations plan possible while minimizing student disruption during the construction of a new École J.H. Sissons from 2020-2022. All involved parties look forward to hearing input from parents so that their recommendations can help shape this exciting project.
